Purpose of report

1. 4. Where a large tranche of new bodies are coming under the scope, e.g. RSLs, the due date will be defined by the commencement date. In other cases where we alerted to, or discover the creation of a new body (usually post 'commencement' or founding), the 'due date' will be defined on a case-by-case basis taking all circumstances into account.
